Let's Get Started

Episode Theme: Serving Others/ God Calls His People

1. In [2 Kings 4:2](#), Elisha offers to help the woman. Is there anyone you can help?
2. Elisha does a lot of really amazing things. He heals people. He raises people from the dead. He helps people. And he points people to God. As you listen to this episode, think about how Elisha's story and Jesus' story are similar.

After You Listen

Elisha was an important prophet who served a very powerful God. As we heard in this story, God turned a small amount of oil into so much oil that a woman could pay off her debt, and God even raised a woman's son from the dead. Because Elisha loved God and people, he asked God to help out many other people, too. And because God loves his people, he made water safe to drink ([2 Kings 2:19-22](#)), made an ax head float ([2 Kings 6:1-7](#)), and fed a lot of hungry people ([2 Kings 4:42-44](#)). But God loved us so much that he wanted to do even more. So, he came down to earth as Jesus to save us.
