Let's Get Started

Episode Theme: Reflecting God- The Holy Spirit Builds the Early Church

1. [Isaiah 41:10](#) says, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God." That is so comforting! When have you been afraid and felt God's comfort? Did that change the way you felt?
2. Stephen was one of the first leaders in the early church. He shared his faith with everyone he met, which made the religious rulers hate him and put him in danger. However, Stephen knew that God was always with him, even at the end. As you listen to this episode, think about how God is always there for you, even when you feel most afraid.

He courageously gave up his life to share the good news. Through all these difficult times, the Holy Spirit was with Stephen to give him strength, courage, and peace.

In [Hebrews 13:5](#), it says, "Never will I leave you. Never will I forsake you." It is such a comfort to remember this when things get tough. God has given you this promise! The Holy Spirit will provide you with the courage and strength to face whatever difficulties come your way. If God is for you, who can be against you? ([Romans 8:31](#))

Challenge
