Here are some tips to help you and your family grow in God, ask him for help, and worship him through it all.

**Ask for help.** We want our kids to ask for help when needed, but we sometimes fail to ask for help ourselves. Pray as a family and model humility and reliance on God. Boldly ask God for help in each area of your life, and your kids will learn to do the same.

**Worship God.** Make time for your family to be creative and worship God in many ways. Play worship music in the car. Have a worship dance party in the living room. Build, paint, cook, and tell stories to glorify God as a family. Share with your kids that God wants us to give him our *whole hearts* in worship. We can't just squeeze worship into our schedules; worship is a lifestyle of magnifying God's goodness with our every breath.

I can't wait to hear if Valentine is walking on the moon or starring in a movie. But even if she does something completely different, I'll still be proud of her. I'm sure you feel the same way and are excited to see what God has in store for your kids. Let's encourage our kids to run with God and follow where he leads this year and in the years to come.
