Memory Verse

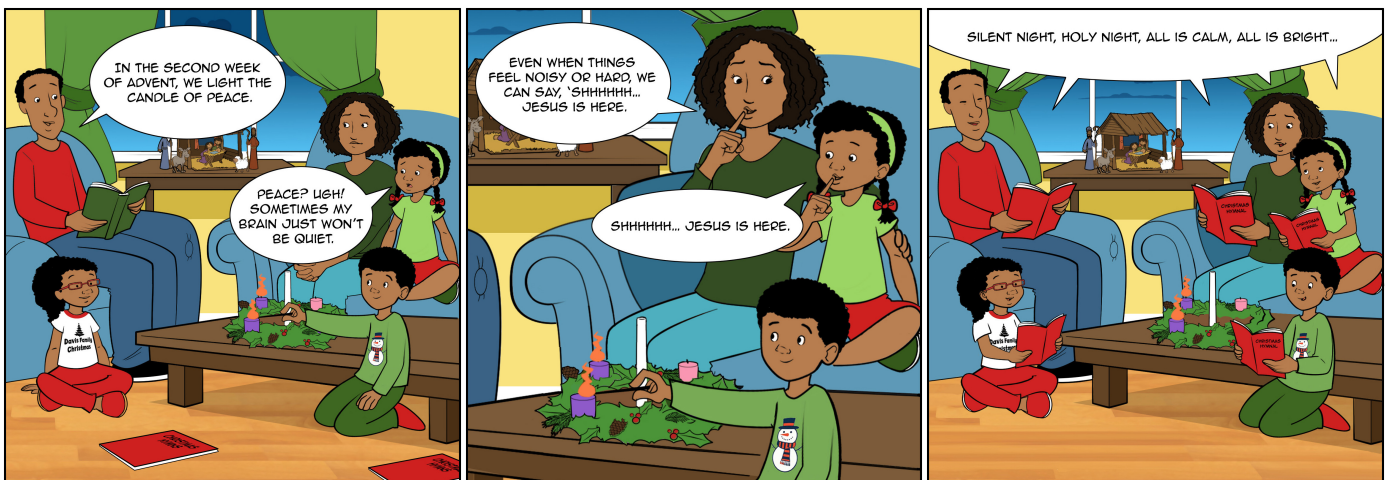
