What do you think of when you hear the word "wise?" Maybe you think of a grandparent, a teacher, or even an owl. It may seem that wise people have all the answers. But did you know that the wisest people are the ones that come to God with questions? Wisdom is not about relying on your own smarts or experience. It's about asking God for his guidance!

There was a young man named Solomon who became king. It was a big job for someone so young and inexperienced! God appeared to Solomon in a dream and told him to ask for anything he wanted. Solomon admitted he didn't know much about being a leader. He asked God to make him wise and teach him the difference between right and wrong. Solomon wasn't asking to become powerful, strong, or rich. He knew he

needed *wisdom* to rule God's people and make a positive impact in the world.
