Memory Verse

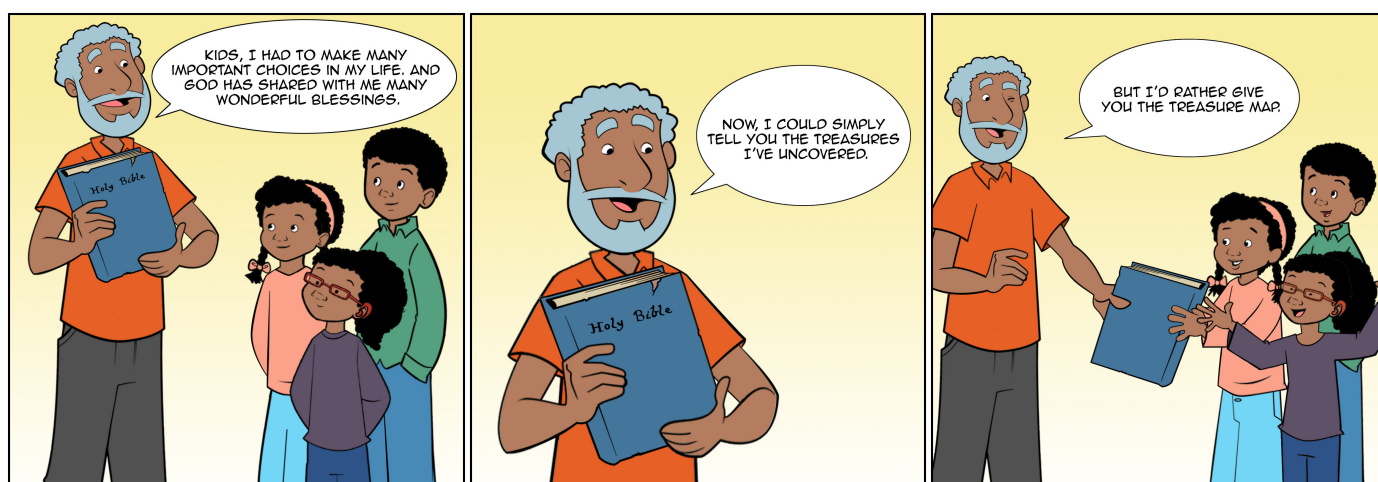
