They don’t even have to be big needs, because God loves us so much. When we remember how God says he will provide for us, it gives us hope we can trust that he *will do* what he promises.

But it’s also important to remember that God’s gifts might not look the way we expect. Just look at how he saved us. He sent his Son to earth as a baby. And then when Jesus grew up, he died on a cross. That’s not how you would have expected him to save us from our sins.

So remember, even if you don’t understand why things are happening the way they are, you can always trust God to provide for you, because he loves you very much.
