Have *you* ever felt that way? Are you tired of always saying the same words when you pray? Or have you wondered if maybe there was a different way to talk to God?

Actually, there are lots of different ways to pray. One of them is called an ACTS Prayer. Each letter stands for a different section of the prayer.

A is for adoration. In this type of prayer, we praise God for who he is and what he has done.

C is for confession. This is when we tell God we're sorry for the ways we've disobeyed God and hurt others.

T is for thanksgiving. Here is where we get to thank God for everything he has done for us: big and small.

S is supplication, which is a fancy way of saying we ask God to take care of us and those we care about—and supply our needs too.

Over the next few devotions, we're going to learn more about each section and find out what they're all about.
