Do you believe your future looks bright? What plans do you have? Have you prayed to God about what's ahead?

In Jeremiah 29:11, the prophet Jeremiah spoke words of hope to God's people who had been living under the control of the Babylonian Empire. Now they faced being forced away from Jerusalem and into exile in Babylon. God's comforting words certainly came during very difficult times.

Our times are different, but we can relate because right now we are dealing with difficulties due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Families have lost loved ones. Parents have lost their jobs. Kids do school, sports, and even playtime differently than before. Covid has disrupted almost every way we do things. We look to
