Let's Get Started

Episode Theme: God is the God of all things.

- 1. In Genesis 1, what does it mean that all God created was good?
- 2. Do you know the order of creation? God spent three days creating spaces, then the next three days filling these spaces.

Day 1: God looked at empty darkness and declared, "Let there be light." And there was light. God enjoyed his light and called it good. Day 2: God looked at the waters and separated them from the sky. He enjoyed his sky and called it good. Day 3: God separated dry ground from the water. He then filled the land with plants and trees of many kinds. God enjoyed his land, his plants, and his trees, and called them all good. Day 4: God filled the sky with the sun in the day and the moon and the stars in the night. He enjoyed his beautiful lights and called them good. Day 5: God filled the sky with all sorts of birds, and filled the waters with amazing sea creatures. He enjoyed all the creatures he designed and called them all good. Day 6: God filled the land with animals, big and small, and called all his animals good. He then created one special creature in his own likeness: mankind! He surveyed everything he had made and said, "Everything I have created is very good!"The next time you're outside, take a minute to look at something God created and enjoy it. As you listen to this episode, thank God for his creation. He designed this world for you and him to enjoy together forever!

After You Listen

The four "Epic Story" episodes tell the story of God in four parts: creation, fall, redemption, and restoration. Creation says "God is the God of all things." The fall says "Everything is broken."
